Dear Parents and Carers

I want to start this letter by thanking you for all your support over this year; can I ask you to pass on these thanks to your children as well. It has been an action-packed year with many amazing achievements: D of E has run across three years groups, our whole school production Matilda and the Year 7 and 8 summer shows were stand out moments for seeing your children shine. We have also been on trips to the theatre and had visiting theatre productions into school, sent teams to UK Maths Challenge, regional chess finals, numerous sporting fixtures, even getting through to the national reading champions quiz in London and winning the Year 8 North-West football cup final.

Students have been on numerous trips including the Year 7 residential, Barcelona, Berlin, Iceland, Geography field trips, Year 10 Alton Towers rewards trip and enjoyed a multitude of visits from outside speakers and workshops. This was all concluded with a stunning prom for Year 11 at Thornton Hall to celebrate all they have achieved academically and more importantly personally throughout their school career, Year 11 were amazing and a credit to all of us.

We are proud of all our students, I am proud of all of them and feel it is a privilege to be the Headteacher at Pensby, where the students come in every day and work positively with staff, and each other to make Pensby High School a positive, welcoming community. A community we are all lucky to share together. Staff and students alike have been a credit to our community this year. This was reflected in the recent 'Good' OFSTED report which highlighted that, 'the school values of Care, Respect, Inspire permeate all that we (they) do'. I thank all of the staff here at Pensby, they have worked incredibly hard throughout a challenging year, thank you.

Examination Results:

GCSE examination results will be available for students on **Thursday 24th August 2023**, arrangements regarding this have already been emailed home.

Our Year 11 have had to deal with a significant amount of challenge throughout their secondary school journey including the COVID lockdowns when they were in Years 8 and 9 and the unknown changes to their GCSE courses: the vast majority have coped with these changes with resilience, good humour and have had a positive mindset despite the challenges they have faced. They are a credit to you as parents, the staff here and most of all themselves.

Arrangements for the start of term in September

Tuesday 5 September 2023 - Year 7 students only are in school

Year 7 attend school from 8.35 am and go straight to the main school hall please.

Wednesday 6 September 2023

All students in ALL years return to school for normal start time - 8.35am on site, to be in form rooms by 8.40am.

As we return to school I would be grateful if you would ensure that we have the correct uniform and equipment ready to start the new school. Your support in this matter is very much appreciated. Full details of the school uniform can be found on the school website: http://www.pensbyhighschool.org/search/school-uniform/58942.html. Please note students are expected to wear trousers or school skirts of a length suitable for office dress, not stretchy skirts please and shoes must be proper school shoes not the trainer hybrid which are sometimes sold in shops. The tone for the year is set in those first few weeks back and we know that being punctual, prepared to learn and dressed in appropriate uniform, all help to secure a positive attitude towards education and a commitment to succeed which carries students through the long term ahead. Uniform is important for a shared sense of community, an obvious pride in who we are as individuals and the school we go to, but at an even more basic level it is about routines and preparation. If we cannot put a pair of shoes on, or we want to argue about the length of a skirt, this tends to be a precursor to arguing about lessons and learning. I have to say that our students do, on the whole, look great and then they take this into everything they do at school. This is a testimony to the effort that you put in as parents and carers, I am grateful, thank you.

You are absolutely key in setting the tone: I cannot overstate the importance your support plays in the success of our children, but I do though understand that now more than ever some families may need help. Fuss Wirral can help support families: https://wirralfuss.co.uk/ and I have a small discretionary fund to help as well, please ask and we will try our best. Can I also ask that if you have uniform that another family can make use of, you donate to FUSS, either directly or if you bring it into school we can pass it on. Can I also remind everyone that we do have breakfast club in the morning, students can get a drink, some toast or cereal and start the day with breakfast. This is open to all and there is no charge. As a school we also employ a 'family advocate' – Di Challinor, Di can help with support in terms of relationships with school, but Di can also signpost and support wider needs, seek benefit support, advice on housing and health needs for families, not just the children at our school.

I would also ask that again we refocus on attendance and punctuality please. I don't think that any school has seen attendance return to pre-pandemic levels, but we need students back to close gaps. Gaps both in terms of their learning, but perhaps more importantly in terms of their friends, their mental/physical well-being and their wider social skills. We know that students who attend more, who are better prepared, who have parents that support their learning do better as a result and we know that in turn impacts on how long and healthy our lives are, choices for employment, positive impacts on our children and grandchildren, and a huge rise in health and well-being, that is the power of education!

Your engagement with your child's education, asking them questions, challenging them to do better and the interest you show are a huge part of their success. We cannot as parents 'fix' things for our children, we cannot do the learning for them, but I promise you that your children tell us about the difference your interest in them and their learning makes to them.

Your children are a credit to you; I am proud and privileged to have the opportunity to lead the school your children attend. They are a credit to you and themselves, we are all immensely proud of them and they deserve a good summer, as do you.

I hope that you have a lovely summer and enjoy all the time you have together as a family.

Dear Parents and Carers

I am delighted to report that Pensby High School remains a 'Good' school. It is evident that the report highlights the relationships within the school community.

Our inspection was led by a Senior HMI and that is never easy. I have to say, that although it was a very demanding two days for the school, I think it was a very fair process.

Clearly the inspection saw, and understood, how hard staff and pupils work to push learning to its best. From teaching, through SEND and the wider work we do around planning for learning, the extended curriculum, and keeping our community safe, feedback from pupils was very positive.

The work that teachers do on a regular basis to improve and refine planned learning is as strong as I have even seen in a school, they really do think about how they can help the children in their care.

I was particularly pleased by the comments from students about how our expectations of everyone's behaviours, both adults and children, make your children feel safe in our care. We work very hard to hold a line around behaviour and safeguarding in their widest senses. It is lovely to hear that the pupils understand why and see the benefit and value of this.

Even though the pupils recognised that sometimes there are very difficult messages to members of our community, they feel safe and supported, in large part, because they know we will have difficult conversations on their behalf.

All of this work is only possible as a result of all the support that so many of you have given to the school, thank you.

It has been a long and challenging five years since the last inspection, much has changed for all of us and all staff have worked tirelessly, and many have gone way beyond what I could have expected.

A big thank you to all Governors and staff, thank you; I know that for all of you it will be a pleasure and pride to read the feedback on your work.

Dear Parents, Guardians and Students,

I just wanted to take some time to introduce myself as the newly appointed Assistant Headteacher for pastoral here at Pensby High School after joining from a school in North Wales.

I have been made to feel very welcome here at Pensby and I am very lucky to teach and to support very polite and well mannered students supported by excellent members of teaching and non-teaching staff.

Our pastoral system is central to the guidance and support we give your child to help him/her to progress well academically.

On joining Pensby High School each child is placed in a mixed ability Tutor Group. Each Year Group also has their own Head of Year who will monitor their progress and help guide students along appropriate learning pathways throughout their school career.

Your child's Tutor is usually the first point of contact if you have any information to share, or concerns about your child's education or welfare.

Subject specific enquiries would normally be addressed to the subject teacher. If in doubt, our Reception staff will happily advise you of the most appropriate person to contact.

Over the next few pages, you will see some useful information and advice on e-safety through to what to do over the summer.

POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS APPS PARENTS / TEACHERS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT

THESE APPS CAN EASILY BE USED AS GROOMING TOOLS BY ONLINE PREDATORS LOOKING TO MEET UP & SEXUALLY ABUSE CHILDREN.

This is not exhaustive, and updated each year to reflect new risks and dangers (updated 2022). New apps are constantly being created, so it's important to monitor what children download.



Allows you to connect with others and share comments, photos and videos. You can add friends, write on people's pages and posts, join groups and play games.



SNAPCHAT

Is one of the most popular apps in recent years. Whilst the app promises that photo's, videos and stories disappear, others can take screenshots of private photo's.

INSTAGRAM

Kids are creating fake accounts to hide content from their parents, according to police. Messages are also deleted once a user leaves a conversation.

WHATSAPP



Allows you to send messages, images and videos in 121 and group chats with your contacts. You can choose to share your live location for up to eight hours with one contact or a group.

OMEGLE



Is a video chat website where users are matched randomly with

KIK MESSAGING KIK



Is a messaging app that allows content normally filtered on a home computer

WHISPER



Is an anonymous social media app that promotes sharing personal secrets with strangers, (new people). It reveals a users location so people can meet up.

CALCULATOR %



Is only one of SEVERAL social media apps disguised as a calculator, the app is actually a secret photo vault to hide photos, videos, files and browser history.

HOT ON NOT



Strangers rate a user's 'attractiveness' with the aim of real-world meet ups in your local area.

ASK, FM



Ann app where users can anonymously ask questions and receive answers. The app has been featured in a number of cyber bullying cases.

YUBO



Similar to Tinder, the app is designed to allow teens to flirt with each other.

BURN BOOK



Anonymous rumors can be posted about people through audio messages, texts and

WISHBONE

This app allows users to compare kids and rate them on a scale.

SKOUT



Is a location based dating app and website. Whilst people under 17 are unable to share private photo's. Children can easily create fake accounts.



Is a dating social media app that allows users to connect with people based on geographic proximity. The app encourages people to meet

TELLOYMN



Anonymous messenger app. It calls itself "the most honest place on the internet." Age controls are inconsistent and sexual explicit material can be found.



is a popular app that looks like a harmless messaging app however it allows private anonymous messaging and is location enabled.



is one of the most popular apps in recent years used for sharing short videos with very limited privacy controls users are vulnerable to explicit material.



FACEBOOK MESSENGER Is one of the most popular message apps in the world. It has already heavily been used by predators and the end-to end encryption will make it even more unsafe.



Is a location based dating app and website. Whilst people under 17 are unable to share private photo's, Children can easily create fake accounts.

KIDSCHAT



DISCORD

Is one of the most popular apps in recent years used for sharing short videos with very limited privacy controls users are vulnerable to explicit material.

VINE



Allows users to watch and post six second videos. While many of the videos are harmless, porn videos do pop up into the feed, exposing your children to sexually explicit material.

POOF



Hides other apps on your phone. If children have apps that they want to keep hidden from their parents, all they have to do is download this app and "poof," their screen



A gaming app that allows video sharing and video chat. Bullying is a problem on Discord. Some of the bigger problems include suicidal ideation, hate speech and graphic images.

HOOP



Hoop is a dating app that connects to SnapChat and allows 12 + teens to swipe on pictures that they like with the purpose of meeting. This leads to issues with fraud and sexual predators

GALLERYVAULT GalleryVault and other vault



apps hide photos and videos. One of the scarier options on it gives the user access to a secret web browser and alerts the user if someone attempts to break into the app

PSST!



Is a chat room app that prides itself on messages being deleted almost immediately from the server, ID-masking, and secretive private chat. For parents, these features are worrying.

Year 7 have been studying Romeo and Juliet this term and some classes spent time outside reading the script. They also read lots of different extracts then created their own stories











Year 8 have been learning all about non-fiction alongside an anthology of texts all about our local area. They have studied the 19C ghost story The Turn of the Screw.










Pensby Pundits: After another successful pitch to The Reading Agency, our book
